Over the span of five years, REEF has transformed from a two-day cinematic experiment intertwined with nature into a five-day festival that captivates over 4000 enthusiasts annually. This journey has involved molding REEF according to aspirations, regional culture, and pressing issues, such as the environments impact, preserving landscapes, pandemic challenges, waste crises, and forest fires. Cinema has served as a compelling medium, drawing the public into rural life and ecology.

At its core, we conduct enlightening workshops on environmental issues for both young minds and adults, encompassing crucial topics like sorting, composting, and recycling. Furthermore, each edition witnesses specialized workshops catering to diverse segments of our audience. The youth delve into short film production, teenagers explore the realm of animation film creation, and we cannot help but marvel at the unyielding spirit and zeal of the women from Akkar, who create one-minute films.

Ultimately, REEF's five-year evolution reflects a profound metamorphosis that fosters a deeper connection between the people and the environment, while highlighting the exceptional beauty of Kobayat's woodland and surroundings.

From its inception as a cinema-nature blend, REEF has progressively expanded. The aim is to connect and bridge with different regions discussing and finding solutions for urgent rural and environmental issues. After 3 off-site editions in Bisri, Rashaya-Kfarmashki, and Hammana, REEF this year extends to Hermel in collaboration with Hermel cultural association to demonstrate the power of art to bridge gaps, extend boundaries, and connect diverse aspects of society.

About REEF

Since 2019, the Council of the Environment and Aflamuna have collaborated to organize a unique festival in the Akkar region of Lebanon, celebrating natural heritage, cinema, and rural culture. The festival has expanded to other regions in the country, and this year, it will be held in Kobayat from August 31 to September 4 and in Hermel from September 8 to September 10. The aim of the festival is to provide access to culture and foster discussions about preserving the environment, even amidst ongoing socio-economic challenges. The theme for the 2023 edition is «Transformations», focusing on the various changes in the natural world and their impacts, as well as exploring alternatives and solutions to address these issues. The festival will feature creative workshops, conferences, films, and field visits, engaging with locals and visitors to stimulate reflection and propose meaningful solutions.

REEF'S ORGANIZERS

The Council of Environment was founded in 1995 in Kobayat as a non-profit association. Since then, it has been working for 30 years to protect Akkar's natural heritage and raise awareness relating to ecological issues and the importance of forest resources. The association was the first in Lebanon to build a watchtower to prevent forest fires. It offers training courses for mountain guides and fire prevention and is involved in awareness workshops in Akkar schools. The Environment Council is also active in the development of ecotourism activities and has forged numerous partnerships with environmental associations to promote the exchange of experience and mutual support.



AFLAMUNA is a cultural nonprofit based in Beirut working to harness the power of independent Arab cinema to elevate the most pressing social, political, and cultural movements of our time. Established as a cooperative under the name of Beirut DC in 1999 by a group of Lebanese filmmakers and cultural organizers, it became a nonprofit organization in 2006 under the same name, launching multiple programs and initiatives that helped independent cinema flourish in the Arab region. Today, after over two decades, AFLAMUNA upholds this legacy while keeping an eye to the future.



THE MASCOT

Turtle

The time-honored tradition of annually designating a mascot serves a meaningful purpose by sensitizing local residents to the critical importance of preserving their native wildlife. Against the backdrop of REEF 2023, the chosen emblematic representative tasked with embodying this crucial mission is the Turtle—an emblem that serves as a poignant and evocative testament to the urgent necessity of protecting and nurturing this extraordinary creature. The Turtle's symbolism stands as a potent reflection of the far-reaching repercussions brought about by the devastating fires that swept through the landscape in Akkar region during the years 2021 and 2022, resulting in a substantial decrease in the Turtle population. Through its embodiment of both determination and vulnerability, the Turtle's presence as the iconic symbol of REEF 2023 emerges as a unifying focal point for collective endeavor, infusing the occasion with a compelling blend of visual impact and emotional resonance that underscores the significance of safeguarding not solely this endangered species, but also the delicate equilibrium of the entire surrounding ecosystem.

THE THEME:

Transformations

Ever attentive to the difficulties faced by the country, REEF has chosen to approach the 2023 edition from the perspective of Transformations. These Transformations manifest as a series of modifications to the natural environment: geological changes, climate change, water pollution, deforestation, and migrations of animal species, leading to social, demographic, and cultural shifts.

REEF 2023 will not only address the negative consequences of these endured Transformations but also explore the alternatives and solutions arising from them: new sustainable lifestyles, consumption patterns, and movements of solidarity and cohesion.

This overarching theme will be woven throughout various creative workshops, conferences, films, and field visits, involving experts, local stakeholders, and residents, with the aim of stimulating reflection and generating proposals.

THE HOST: Silk Factory, Kobayat

The Silk Factory in Kobayat emerged as a prominent establishment in the late 18th century, thriving alongside the cultivation of silkworms. Its origins trace back to a modest enterprise founded by the «Faraoun» Family, evolving over time. As the 19th century dawned, a significant transformation occurred when «Alesandro Cassini,» an Italian surgeon hailing from Rome, united with a woman from Kobayat in matrimony. This union led to his acquisition of the factory from the «Faraoun» Family, subsequently modernizing and expanding it, along with establishing two additional facilities in Andaket. Under his stewardship, these factories garnered renown for producing some of the most exquisite and superior quality natural silk, which found its direct route to Lyon, France.

However, the mid 20th century witnessed the ascendancy of artificial silk, casting a shadow over the reign of natural silk. In recent history, precisely fifteen years ago, Mr. Elie Hakme assumed ownership of the factory, demonstrating a laudable gesture by generously offering its use for the REEF festival.

He is also a founding member of the «Cooperative des Métiers du Cinéma», initiated in 2022. Korek has been involved in producing numerous Lebanese, Syrian, and Palestinian films, working as a co-producer, post-production producer, or VFX supervisor, collaborating with acclaimed Lebanese Filmmakers like Mohamad Soueid, Ghassan Salhab, Jocelyne Saab, Nadine Labaki, Burhan Alawiye, Michel Kammoun, and Elie Khalife on features, documentaries, shorts, and animation projects.



Hady Zaccak is an award-winning Lebanese filmmaker and lecturer-researcher at IESAV film School, Saint-Joseph University, Beirut. He is known for his +20 socio-political documentaries about Lebanon and the Arab world. Notable works include «Ya Omri» (2017), «Kamal Joumblatt, Witness and Martyr» (2015), «Marcedes» (2011), and «A History Lesson» (2009). He has authored two books on cinema. His latest exhibition, «In this place: Reels of Beirut» (2022), was showcased at Mina Image Centre in Beirut. Zaccak's contributions have garnered recognition and acclaim both within Lebanon and internationally.


